Sri Lankan Delights Come To Canterbury

An evening celebrating culinary delights from Sri Lanka is being held to raise money the social and educational welfare of children orphaned by the tsunami.

The social get together is at Chaucer Technology School, Spring Lane, Canterbury, on Saturday, November 3, from 7pm-11.30pm.

The £18 entrance fee includes the chance to sample a full range of traditional meals from Sri Lanka, plus listen to music and watch dancers from the country. The food is being prepared by specialist chefs from the The Golden Platter caterers from London. Tickets are £12 for children 5-12 years old; £2 for under 5s.

The evening also includes live music from a band playing Sri Lankan music and popular hits, a fund raising tombola and raffle.

The event is organised by a volunteer group from Kent that is working to help devastated communities in Sri Lanka.

The KASTDA Fund – the Kent Association for Sri Lankan Tsunami Daruwo – is dedicated to helping orphans throughout the stricken country, and members have visited on fact-finding missions to see how best they can help.

Links have already been forged with orphanages and schools and KASTDA funds have been released to help around a hundred children and young people.

Meththa Methananda, who is a founder member of the KASTDA Fund, said: “The social evening is one of our major fund raising events this year and it follows a successful similar evenings in Canterbury and Birchington in the last two and a half years. As well as being a chance for people to try out dishes from our country, it is also the opportunity for the volunteers to mix socially. “
